TENTS ARE BACK AND OPERATIONAL: Following last weekend's inclement weather, the two Emergency Room screening tents and drive-thru screening station are back and operational. To enter McDonough District Hospital, staff and those patients and visitors not experiencing respiratory symptoms enter through ER tent #1. Patients and visitors experiencing respiratory ailments should enter through ER tent #2.

HOW TO MAKE PROTECTIVE FACEMASKS: After further research on homemade masks and finding a pattern that will work with the equipment we have on hand, MDH released a sewing pattern for the general public to use. NURSE TRIAGE HOTLINE AND DRIVE-THRU SCREENING STATION: If a person is experiencing symptoms of fever, cough, or shortness of breath they should call the nurse triage hotline at (309) 836-1715 or their primary care provider. The nurse triage hotline will operate from 7 a.m.-7 p.m. seven days a week. The drive-thru screening station will operate from 8 a.m.-8 p.m. seven days a week.

Patients should be 18 years or older and MUST be pre-registered to access the drivethru service. Patients that have not called the MDH nurse triage hotline or their primary care provider will be asked to call the hotline to pre-register. All testing requires an order by a physician or nurse practitioner. We ask for no more than two occupants per vehicle.
