"When our patients are ill enough to warrant admission to MDH, we are using several treatment modalities. Those who need oxygen can be treated with a variety of options including: oxygen by nasal canula or mask, high flow heated oxygen (Vapo-Therm), a pressurized mask known as Bi-Pap, or a ventilator. In addition, we infuse intravenously the antiviral drug Remdesivir and Decadron as a steroid. Most patients receive vitamin D and zinc as those supplements have been shown to suppress the COVID-19 virus. We are offering preventive anticoagulation to each patient. There are several options for anticoagulation, so these drugs are tailored to a patient's needs. During the last six weeks, we have been able to obtain from our Mississippi Valley Regional Blood Center a

blood product known as COVID Convalescent Plasma. This is a blood product obtained from someone who has had the COVID illness. That blood product contains antibodies that would aid our patient in their fight against the COVID virus. This product is not always effective, but certainly helpful. Our COVID plasma has been arriving to us from all around the country. Our blood bank now reports that supplies of Convalescent Plasma are in short supply everywhere. We would encourage everyone who has been ill with the COVID virus to consider being donors for this blood product. Those who have been most ill and required a hospital stay with some type of oxygen support would likely be the best candidates. Any person wishing to donate would need to be 14 days from their last symptoms, completely recovered before donating, and be an eligible blood donor."
