SELL BACK OF SICK TIME:

An Employee Opinion Survey was conducted in November 2003, which solicited comments from employees regarding many aspects of their employment experience including the salary and benefit package. Common requests on this survey were for some type of payout of accumulated sick time, recognition for employees with good attendance, recognition of employees with seniority, and a bonus for employees who have reached the maximum of their scale. After carefully considering your comments, a "sell back of sick time" benefit was developed and implemented effective January 1, 2005 and continues for this year.

This benefit is available to full-time employees with a minimum of 10 years of service and 800 hours (83% of the maximum accrual of 960 hours) of accrued sick time and part-time employees with a minimum of 10 years of service and 475 hours (83% of the maximum accrual of 576 hours) of sick time as of January 1, 2014. Sell back rates are as follows:

Years of Service	Full-time	All Others (Except Registry)
10-14	16 hrs each year	8 hrs each year
15-19	32 hrs each year	16 hrs each year
20-24	48 hrs each year	24 hrs each year
25+	64 hrs each year	32 hrs each year



Is there a listing on the Intranet of all the Codes?

All the codes are listed in the "Quick Reference Guide" on the Intranet at the very top of the left hand menu under "Emergency Preparedness". Also under the "Quick Reference Guide" is the Fire Safety protocol.

Who is allowed to pull the fire alarm if there is smoke or fire present?

Anyone can initiate a response by pulling the manual pull station located in your area.

What is the first thing an employee should do when there is a Code announced overhead?

Please refer to the "Quick Reference Guide" for response needed for each particular Code.

If the employee does not hear an overhead page, and sees the fire doors in place, what should they do?

Remain where you are and wait for instructions.

What is the number for the Communications department? How does an employee make an overhead page?

Dial 0 for the operator and 7-4-4-4 to initiate an overhead page from your phone, please ensure you hang up after the 7-4-4-4 page.

Who is in charge during a Code Red, Orange or Green emergency?

Code Red: The Macomb Fire Department and the Administrative Person in Charge (APIC).

Code Orange: The "Incident Commander" after activation of the HICS plan.

Code Green: The person in the department that has been SECURE trained and is most familiar with the acting out individual.

Dave, how can someone contact you during an emergency?

Through the switchboard by radio.

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ways to spot a phishing scam

How to identify phishing scams

A phishing scam essentially works like a con job: someone has to convince you that they're reliable before they try to steal from you. This is most often done through fake emails that look like they come from a trusted source and ask you to click on a link to a website.

The website will be designed to look legitimate and from a service provider you're likely to use. It will also ask for user information.

Once the information is obtained, it can be used for identity theft, financial theft, or fraud.

- 1. Don't trust the logo or email address It's easy enough for phishers to copy a real company logo, and even fake the "From" email address to look like it comes from a trusted source. Don't trust the display name, as those are easily changed to mask the real email address.
- 2. Be suspicious of urgent requests

Phishers can use links in emails to obscure the actual URL, which takes you to a fake account. Requests like your bank suspending your account unless you click on "this link" is an example. A trusted company will give you the full URL in the text, not a link. The safest thing to do is type out the URL in your browser, rather than clicking on it.

3. Check for typos or spelling mistakes Reputable companies have copywriters to check their emails, so if you're noticing bad grammar and typos, be on the alert.

Similarly, check the URL of the company for misspellings or strange versions of the URL

www.hetznerZA.com instead of www.hetzner.co.za



4. Don't open unexpected attachments A common phishing tactic is spreading viruses and malware through attachments, which can damage files or steal passwords from your computer.

Simple ways to prevent being scammed

The best defense, along with following the tips above, is to follow basic security practices.

Only use a strong password

Delete emails that ask for personal information Don't reply, click on links or call phone numbers in these emails.

Never email personal or financial information Email is not a secure enough method to send personal or financial information. If you're transferring large sums into someone's bank account, always verify their banking details telephonically first.

Review credit card and bank account statements It's important to check your credit card and bank statements as soon as you receive them to check for suspicious or unauthorized charges.

Don't share your password on the phone
