

## Looking for Advice?

#### Dear Lucy,

We recently learned my father in-law has been diagnosed with an aggressive form of cancer. Although the prognosis is good, my husband and I are devastated. We are very concerned about the affect this is going to have on our children, ages 6 and 8. Grandpa lives in our neighborhood, is their primary sitter who picks them up from school and watches them until I come home. We're not sure what to tell them about the situation or even if we should do so.

#### Dear Concerned,

When someone you love is given a serious medical diagnosis it's hard enough to cope with your ownemotions, never mind explaining it to your children. Whether to do so, how to do so and how much informationto share are questions people often ask. A diagnosis of cancer in someone so close to your children seems like asecret that would be impossible to keep. You can't protect your kids all the time and energy you would put intodoing so simply could be better used elsewhere.

Children are amazingly intuitive when it comes to sensing problems in the family and not informing them
of what's going on may lead to them imaging the worst. They may overhear conversations between you and
your spouse and if they don't have adequate information they're likely to fill in the details with inaccurate fears.
Children may also conclude if their parents aren't telling them what's going on, whatever it is must be too awful
to talk about.

How your children respond to information shared is often dependent on how you and your spouse are handling the news. If you can present information calmly, and are able to offer a feeling of confidence, this is how they likely will feel as well. Honest communication and using terms they will understand, will help them feel more comfortable with the news. Refer to Grandpa's illness with proper terms and provide age appropriate details. They don't need to know all the specifics about his cancer treatment, but they do need to know grandpa may experience side effects, such as being tired, losing weight, not feeling well or losing his hair. Serious illnesses may mean a change in routines, so help the children plan for this. They need to know he won't be able to pick them up from school, they'll have a different sitter or that you may need to miss out on some school activities because you have to help Grandpa.

You may be asked the most difficult question – is he going to die? If you don't know for certain the answer to this question, it's best not to say no. You can offer reassurance that grandpa is getting the best treatment possible to help him in his recovery and you may want to focus on future plans that will include him to provide hope that things will work out well.

Salary increases are based on individual productivity and performance as outlined by the individual's job description. Increases are effective the first day of the last pay period that begins in the month. The effective date for each month will vary depending on how the pay period falls.

**Example: January 2017 Evaluations:** The first day of the last pay period beginning in January is Sunday, January 22, 2017. That pay period ends Saturday, February 4, 2017. The rate increase is effective for that entire pay period and will be reflected on the February 9, 2017 paycheck.

## **Basic Life Support Training Center**

MDH has recently been upgraded to the American Heart Association (AHA) status of a Training Center for Basic Life Support (CPR and First Aid).

For over four years, MDH has been affiliated with the AHA through the Training Center at Blessing Hospital in Quincy for all CPR/First Aid, Advanced Cardiac Life Support and Pediatric Advanced Life Support courses. Life Safety Courses offered at MDH has grown and were stretching the resources at Blessing Hospital. Staff Development at MDH has been working through the application process since March of 2016 and recently were accepted as a Training Center for Basic Life Support.

As a Training Center, MDH will continue most of the same processes as before, without having to go through Blessing Hospital. They will still provide training for employees and the community, as well as CPR, ACLS and PALS instructor classes.

MDH certified over 1,300 people for CPR and/or First Aid in 2016 and maintain records for over 60 instructors. Also in 2016, MDH switched to electronic certification cards and no longer use paper.

MDH staff and instructors are proud to continue our affiliation with the AHA, an organization committed to education on heart disease and stroke, and improving resuscitation outcomes.



## President's Report

The MDH Board of Directors met January 16. Here is Mr. Boyd's report to the Board for the accounting period of December 20 -January 16, 2017.



### Quality and Innovation

#### Service Excellence

Service Excellence participated in the planning and kick-off call with Press Ganey on December 15, 2016, to review details and timing for the upcoming Employee Engagement Survey.

This planning meeting covered all items related to the project scope and management of resources. A bi-weekly conference call schedule has been established to keep the engagement survey project on track.

The Employee Engagement Survey is scheduled for late spring or early summer 2017.

### Projects

Phlebotomy Wait Times: The project is moving to document the process changes into the standard procedures for the lab and registration. Final wait time results will be obtained before the project closes. Monitoring of the wait times will continue for several months after the project closes.

### Infection Control

The 2016 Annual Mask Fit Testing was wrapped up in December. Mask fit testing involves refresher education on what disease are airborne transmission and helps ensure staff have the proper sized mask to wear in airborne isolation rooms. Infection Control mask fit tested a total of 253 employees and contracted staff.

### Patient Safety

MDH has joined the Michigan, Illinois and Wisconsin Hospitals Partner for Quality Improvement Program: Hospital Improvement Innovation Network (HIIN). The HIIN diagnostic report and recommendations for engagement in 2017 included the following: participating in the improvement action network, conducting an improvement advisor site visit focusing on ADE-hypoglycemia, hospital-acquired conditions simulation training focusing on sepsis or CAUTI, and peer-to-peer learning networks on readmissions.

### Physician Recruitment/ Retention

Physician, Advance Practice Provider Recruitment & Outreach Services – Update:

**OB/GYN:** We are continuing to work with Dr. Amerson regarding her IL medical licensure as well as other on-boarding activities. She has begun to work with a realtor and developing a relocation plan. A community welcome reception is planned for Tuesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> from 2PM-4PM in Auditoriums A & B. During the transition for Dr. Amerson, we have Dr. Edward Ricaurte providing interim coverage throughout January, February, and March 2017.

**Pediatrics:** Based on initial phone interview activity with two candidates, we are continuing with the search. A targeted direct mail campaign is being sent out this month to both practicing and Pediatricians in training within Illinois and surrounding states. This, along with additional recruitment activity via our e-mail blasts and continued work with contingency recruiters, we hope to move forward with additional candidate presentations.

**Psychiatry Nurse Practitioner:** A Psychiatry Nurse Practitioner candidate has been identified and we are moving to the initial phone interview stage at this time.

**Hospitalist Medicine:** The practicing Hospitalist that we extended a draft proposal to has decided to stay within the Chicago area. We have begun dialogue with a recent locum tenens physician that performed well this month, regarding a part-time practice opportunity.

### Outreach Services

### Community Outreach

Kelly Shiraki, CHES, Health Educator for Outreach Services is coordinating two community programs, featuring, Teepa Snow, one of America's leading educators on dementia. Two community programs are being offered: Dementia 360 -Seeing It From All Directions on February 22 from 5:30рм-7:30рм & Helping a Faith Community Care for Its Members & Families Living with Dementia on February 23 from 2:00PM to 4:30PM. With February being Heart Health Month, Stephanie Crockett, M.S.Ed., CHES, Health Educator for Outreach Services is coordinating two programs. MDH, in partnership with Prairie Cardiovascular, will host, Sonja Jones (previous NBC's Biggest Loser Finalist) for two educational sessions. "Lessons from a Loser" will be provided to Macomb Schools High School Students. "Join The Journey" will be open to the community at the SRC Outreach Center. Both programs are themed at encouraging positive, personal choices regarding health habits as well as highlighting services from MDH and Prairie Cardiovascular. More information will be shared within the upcoming weeks.

#### Provider Outreach

Drs. Patel & Wehner were the key note speakers for the "Straight Talk Program" hosted by the University of Illinois Extension Center in partnership with MDH Outreach Services. Approximately, 240 area sixth grade students were in attendance representing Macomb Schools, St. Paul School, West Prairie Schools, and Bushnell-Prairie City Schools. Dr. Patel & Dr. Wehner spoke to the students about body awareness and changes taking place during this time of their lives. Students also had an opportunity to ask questions of the physicians.

#### Employer Outreach

MDH Outreach Services provided an on-site screening program to McDonough Power employees in January 2017. Work continues in building our partnership with NTN Bower Corporation within three areas:

- Enhancing pre-employment physicals at Convenient Care;
- Utilization of Dr. Minter as the company physician;
- Incorporation of Rehabilitation Services into the pre-hire process.

### Information Systems

#### Cerner Update

We are working with Cerner on the transition plan for Dr. Mitchell's office to our Cerner configuration.

The hope is to have this completed by March depending on Cerner's ability to perform the setup.

We have an additional physician dynamic documentation training session with the Cerner staff scheduled the week of February 6<sup>th</sup>.

Setup of the automated appointment reminder system has been completed for the MMG clinics. The reminder system uses the scheduled appointments within the clinics to call for verification of the appointment via phone or text messages to patients.

We have a demonstration for the Power Chart Maternity application set for early February. This application will replace the current GE Centricity Fetal Charting system that is used in the obstetrics department and complete the loop of EMR charting from pre-natal visits to delivery within the Cerner applications.

### Financial Performance

### December 2016

Total Patient Revenue for the month was down 7.8% from budget. Volume declines in ED have a trickle down effect in most areas, including inpatient census as the majority of our admissions come from the ED. Year to Date, ED visits are down 13.8% from budget and 12.4% from last year. At this point, the decline in ED volumes is unlikely due to our purposeful focus with cost effectively managing our ACO patients as it is really too early in the game for any significant impact. Obviously ED volumes have a high correlation with the size of the population of the market they serve and certainly the changes in WIU enrollment and staff are of concern. Either way, the ED volumes have a negative impact in

most of the areas reported. Surgery volumes, while not at budget for the month, are picking up slowing as they are only 3 procedures short of the budget target. Swing Bed admissions, while initially off to a slow start, continue to post some positive numbers to budget.

Total Patient Revenue was down 5.7% from budget for the month. While not apparent when looking at our bottom line, we are moving closer to our budget targets each month (Nov down 7.0%; Oct down 16.8%; Sept down 25.7%). Inpatient Revenue was down 7.0% which is a reflection of the lower admissions including the reduction in the average length of stay from 3.4 days to 3.1 days. Total Deductions from Revenue were above budget this month by 3.2%. Our contractual adjustments spiked up as the state paid on \$2.4M of Medicaid AR this month. Total Operating Expenses were 3.3% above budget or about \$242K over with a large swing in Pharmacy expenses as we are working through some Cerner transition issues. We also had some startup supply and equipment expenses with the purchase of the existing Podiatry practice assets. You will notice however, that year to date Supplies and Drugs are still under budget so expect to see that work its way through in the coming months. We ended the month with a loss of \$1,594,622.

### Facility Planning

#### Women's Center

Schematic design has been completed for the project. We have been working with the design team to develop a plan for relocating the OB Department during the construction phase. This is in order to seek a determination from IDPH as to whether or not they will allow the relocation. Once that determination is made, construction plans can be developed. In the interim, the design team continues to work with the end users to complete detailed design specifications for the Women's Center.

### Public Relations Report

Public Relations & Marketing Report for Activities within the month of December 2016.

#### Website and Social Media

During December there were 30,673 home page visits, 4,463 career views and 15,037 calendar views.

The MDH Facebook page is now at over 1,532 likes, gaining 47 likes in December. Twitter has increased to over 311 followers. Information promoted on Social Media included: donations to the Women's Center campaign, Festival of Trees events and highlights, Dessert with a Doc, Pain Management Center, Sports Medicine & Rehabilitation Services, Family Clinic, Convenient Care holiday hours, job of the week and openings, MMG providers and newsletter, Apple Award and more.

#### News media

December news included the following: Pain Management article on Chronic pain, a correction about recent billing statements, highlights from Festival of Trees, Dessert with a Doc, Apple Award, Convenient Care holiday hours.

Other December advertising included; Festival of Trees, Convenient Care holiday hours, Senior Behavioral Health, Home Health & Hospice, Orthopedics, Obstetrics & Gynecology Clinic, Pain Management Center, Family Clinic and Dr. Ali.

### Other

The quarterly CEO session was recorded and placed on the Intranet for employees who were unable to attend view it. The Winter issue of Health Connection (MMG newsletter) came out December 1.

### Foundation Report

This report reflects activity held within the month of December 2016.

### Annual Support

In December, \$82,613.43 was received in cash; 271 gifts and 26 memorials were processed. Some of the areas receiving support included: Alzheimer's Support, Dolores Kator Switzer Women's Center (DKSWC), Emergency Services Expansion, Festival of Trees, Hospice, Permanent Endowment, and PROS.

### DKSWC Capital Campaign

To date, \$4,278,354.04 has been raised toward the DKSWC Campaign goal of \$5.5M. A \$15,000 gift was received from Azelia Severs & family in support of the project. A grant application was submitted for Waste Management and six others are in progress. Grants pending are Ameren, BNSF, Gladys Brooks, McDon Power. Niemann Foods, Springfield Clinic, Verizon and Walgreens. The next meeting is scheduled on January 11.

**Golden Apple Society** New Golden level (\$10,000) member is Dick and Azelia Severs & family! Invitations for the February 2 Recognition Reception at the Macomb Country Club were mailed and the RSVP's are rolling in. A total of 22 new members joined the Society in 2016 and will be recognized at the Reception. The next meeting is set for January 12.

### PROS

The annual appreciation meeting was held on December 8, where the committee reviewed 2016 and began plans for 2017. For the year, PROS members donated \$37,703.37 to MDH and welcomed 68 new members for a total of 361 employees supporting PROS. Plans are underway for the Big Game Party on February 3.

### Festival of Trees

The Festival events were a success with 1,152 participants attending (Teddy Bear T 82; Jingle 'n Mingle 204; Festival 866). A total of \$35,790 was raised reflecting a profit of \$29,374.80 for DKSWC. The committee will host a wrap-up meeting on January 26.

### Century Club

The 2016 Century Club Drive ended the year with 71 new members (60 PROS); 394 total members (304 PROS); and \$13,680.85 raised (\$13,430.85 DKSWC/\$250.00 Baby Talk).

### Foundation Board

The quarterly meeting followed by the annual finance meeting is scheduled for January 11.


