MDH has new signage in both the ER and main hallway, near Radiology, stating our policy on aggressive behavior.



Performance Evaluation Rate Increases

Salary increases are based on individual productivity and performance as outlined by the individual's job description. Increases are effective the first day of the last pay period that begins in the month. The effective date for each month will vary depending on how the pay period falls.

Example: January 2020 Evaluations

The first day of the last pay period beginning in January is Sunday, January 19, 2020. That pay period ends Saturday, February 1, 2020. The rate increase is effective for that entire pay period and will be reflected on the February 6, 2020 paycheck.
