Nutrition and Pain Management

Have you ever thought about how what you choose to eat effects how much physical pain you will experience (particularly if you have chronic pain)? This may be a new idea to you, but some non-western medical systems such as Chinese Medicine and Ayruveda have tapped into the pain reducing benefits of certain nutrients for centuries. For pain management, nutrition is most often used in combination with other modalities such as: acupuncture, relaxation/meditation, manual manipulation, medication, and physiotherapy. It often helps improve the effectiveness of the other pain control modalities, including pain medications.

Here are a few steps you can take toward eating a diet may help improve your level of pain:

- Choose your fats wisely: Eat more omega- 3 fatty acids (coldwater fish like salmon, mackerel, tuna, walnuts, flax seed) and extra virgin olive and cold pressed canola oil.
- Eat less corn oil, vegetable oil, conventional animal fat and trans or hydrogenated fats
- Eat less refined, low fiber carbohydrates like sugar, sodas, white bread, and cornflakes
- Instead choose foods higher in fiber and phytonutrients like whole grains and brightly colored fruit and vegetables for your carbohydrate sources
- Choose less conventional animal proteins such as meat, milk, cheese and choose more vegetable sources of protein such as nuts, seeds, beans, lentils and with moderate to low amounts of pasture raised animal proteins
- Eat less highly processed foods such as fast foods, canned, prepackaged, and instant foods
- Eat more fresh and lightly processed foods (as close to their natural state as possible)
- Try adding some anti-inflammatory herbs and spices such as rosemary, thyme, basil, turmeric, ginger, garlic, cayenne peppers, cloves, cinnamon, or sage to your menus

Whether you or your loved ones are experiencing a little or a lot of pain, adding a nutritional component to your pain management plan may prove to be more beneficial than you might think.

McDonough District Hospital Tuition Reimbursement

McDonough District Hospital encourages employees to pursue college course(s) which will improve their job knowledge and skills, broaden their scope of health care understanding, and contribute to higher levels of overall competency throughout MDH.

An employee who has completed six months of employment at MDH may apply for tuition reimbursement. The course content will be directly related to the enhancement of the employee's present job or related to a position staffed at MDH that the employee plans to pursue.

Employees are eligible for reimbursement out-ofpocket costs for tuition only. Books, fees, and materials will be paid by the employee. Annual tuition is for classes taken from fall semester through summer semester. The limit per year per employee is:

Full-time, Status 1 \$3000 per year Part-time Agreement, Status 7 \$2000 per year Part-time, Status 2 \$1000 per year

CDC Standard Precautions for All Patient Care

Standard Precautions are used for all patient care. They're based on a risk assessment and make use of common sense practices and personal protective equipment use that protect health care providers from infection and prevent the spread of infection from patient to patient.

Standard Precautions includes the following basic principles:

- Performing Hand Hygiene prior to and after patient contact or contact with the patient's environment.
- Use of personal protective equipment (PPE) whenever there is an expectation of possible exposure to infectious material.
- Following respiratory hygiene/cough etiquette principles for patients and health care workers.
- Ensuring appropriate patient placement and isolation precautions based on CDC guidelines.
- Properly handling and properly cleaning/ disinfecting patient care equipment, instruments/ devices and the environment.
- Handling textiles and laundry carefully.
- Following safe injection practices with PPE as well as procedure based precautions (i.e. masks with lumbar punctures, epidurals, and for central linesfull barrier, PPE including masks).
- Ensure health care worker safety including proper handling of needles and other sharps.

These basic principles guide us in our everyday work to protect ourselves and the patients we serve. They tell us what PPE we wear, when/where we don the PPE and where/when we remove PPE. These principles are evidence-based practice that must be followed by all health care workers regardless of job duties or titles.




