"The achievement of 4.5 stars is an accomplishment everyone in home health is proud of, reflective of their hard work and the exemplary care they provide to patients," said Marcia McGrew, MDH Leader of Home Health & Hospice.

Although the recently achieved 4.5 rating will be not be displayed on Home Health Compare until April 2016, consumers can visit medicare.gov/homehealthcompare any time to compare home health organizations nationwide.



### Changes to Cafeteria Charges

In the cafeteria, employees can use their name badge to pay for purchases and receive an employee discount in return. With the new payroll system, a change in payment will occur. Exact charges accrued during a pay period will be deducted from your check automatically when your badge is used. Deposits from your paycheck into a cafeteria account will no longer occur as it had in the past.

If an account balance exists, then charges each pay period will be deducted from the account until the account reaches zero. Once the account balance reaches zero, the actual charges made during the pay period will be deducted from your check for the exact amount owed.

### Looking for Advice?

### Dear Lucy,

My husband and I had a rule for our daughter, Amber, that she would not be able to date until she was 16. The day after her 16<sup>th</sup> birthday Amber announced to us she in fact was "in a relationship" and her partner is a fellow classmate. The classmate is also female. We were a bit shocked and initially assumed this was a phase she was going through but Amber tells me she's had feelings for this young woman for some time and she genuinely cares about her. How could she know her sexual orientation at such a young age?

### Dear Worried,

The fact that your daughter was open about sharing this difficult subject with both of you suggests you have a good relationship with her, so please give yourself a pat on the back for this. Adolescence is a time full of doubt and confusion about personal identity and interpersonal relationships. Trying to determine where they fit in and who they fit with can be overwhelming. For teens, physical sexuality is new, evolving and confusing. It is normal to wonder whether feelings for same sex friends have a sexual element to them. Experimentation and testing the waters is to be expected. Figuring out one's sexual orientation can be an exciting as well as a scary process, and one that is different for each individual. Some people are sure of their sexuality as children and for others it is clearer as they become teens. Still some individuals continue to question their sexual orientation into adulthood. A person's sexual orientation defines who they are physically and emotionally attracted to - that is, to people of the same sex (gay or lesbian) or opposite sex (heterosexual) or to members of both sexes (bisexual). Youth have a sexual orientation even if they are not yet sexually active. The world can be a difficult place for teens to navigate, particularly if they are gay, lesbian or bisexual (LGB.) Having supportive and accepting parents is extremely helpful for the mental health challenges that LGB youth face. Creating an environment where you are willing to talk about the topic, being aware of your own biases, communicating your opinions in a clear and respectful manner, while allowing your teen to have her own opinions will help promote future conversations and can help reassure your daughter she can feel safe talking with you. All adolescents need accurate information about sexual health so if you are not comfortable discussing these particulars, having your daughter meet with a medical practitioner may be helpful. It's important to check in on whether she is being harassed or teased by her peers and identify who she can talk with should that happen. Focusing on self-esteem issues and reassuring her she is loved by her mom and dad are also crucial. # President's Report

The MDH Board of Directors met March 21, 2016. Here is Mr. Boyd's report to the Board for the accounting period of February 16 through March 21, 2016.



### Service Excellence

Service Excellence and Quality and Innovation have advanced the way employees can submit ideas for departmental or organizational improvement by introducing an electronic version for idea generation. This is in addition to the original paper version.

The purpose is to provide staff with a fast, simple and meaningful way to share their ideas for improvement with leadership.

Expansion to an electronic version also allows department leaders to easily review and monitor progress on ideas submitted from their staff. In addition, the idea list can easily be reviewed by the Quality Council who is responsible for directing improvement teams for those ideas affecting more than one unit or department.

### Projects

### HOME TO STAY

Reducing 30 day readmissions is our team's goal. Data measurement system is built for three populations: CHF patients, Knee/Hip replacement patients and other inpatients at risk for readmission. Next steps include: assign intervention workload for CHF patients; define intervention for Knee/Hip replacement patients; and evaluate intervention effectiveness for other inpatients at risk for readmission.



MDH's Fall Prevention Team continues researching and implementing improvement efforts to reduce harm occurred from patient falls. Audits have been conducted by unit champions and there was a slight decrease in percentage compliance from January to February but still remain above average overall. Results of the audits are shared with staff and improvement efforts are to be discussed at the next fall prevention team meeting. The post fall huddle report is being redesigned and tab alarms are being mounted in every patient room.

MDH has joined the IHA-MHA HEN in efforts to engage in innovative and team-based strategies to reduce patient harms by 40% and preventable readmissions by 20%. MDH has chosen two practices from the Road Map to Patient and Family Engagement (PFE) to implement which include the following: family initiated rapid response teams and additional training to enhance change-of-shift reporting at the bedside in efforts to improve quality of care for patients in the hospital. Change of shift audits have been conducted to identify areas of opportunity.

2 year employee wellness partnership as well as additional support MDH can be in the coming years. Krystal Wagner will be providing lead clinical support to NTN Bower for pre-employment physicals and minor injury treatment, starting this month. Adrian MacGregor and Stephanie Crockett are working with representatives of NTN regarding further support MDH can provide regarding additional services in the area of health, wellness, and prevention.

### Information Systems

**Cerner Electronic Medical Record** We are officially inside of the 100 day mark and as of March 15<sup>th</sup>, we have 83 days to the Cerner go-live date. Departments are feeling the pace quicken for addressing their area needs with the Cerner team. The next clinical integrated testing week will start on April 18<sup>th</sup> with the financial Integration testing the week of April 25<sup>th</sup>. After that, it will be a sprint to the finish line for all areas to complete training and prepare for the go-live operation on June 6<sup>th</sup>.

# Optimum Payroll and Time and Attendance

We have completed three parallel time and attendance and payroll periods with the Optimum system. The final dual payroll will end March 19<sup>th</sup> and March 20<sup>th</sup> will mark the start of the first official payroll period to be processed only from the Optimum system.

### Financial Performance February 2016

Overall, activity was up for the month by 2.5% with increases in inpatient revenue due to an increase in admissions in both adult and newborn and in OP ancillary revenue due to an increase in surgical volumes. The Swing Bed Unit has not taken off as we had hoped and 80% below budget for the month. Total Patient Revenue for the month was above the fixed budget by 6.5% or \$949K. Total Deductions from Revenue were negative to budget by 6.4% due to the increase in contractual adjustments from the mix of payers. Net Patient Revenue ended the month above the fixed budget by \$407K. Total Operating Expenses were below the fixed budget by 8.5% or \$552K. We ended the month with a positive bottom line of \$858,216 - \$1,030,638 above the fixed budget for the month.

Year to Date activity is still down 2.0% with the largest decreases in Emergency Services and Swing Beds compared to budget though Emergency Services is 22.2% above last years. Total Operating Revenue YTD is above budget by 3.3% or \$1.7M with Total Operating Expenses below budget YTD by \$1.1M. YTD Net Income is \$4.33M -- above both budget and last year.

## Facility Planning

### MDH Renovation

• The Acute Care renovations on West wings is substantially complete and the required documentation for IDPH inspection for occupancy was submitted 3/3/16. IDPH has 10 days to review the submission and make the determination whether or not they will deem the submission complete or request additional information. Once it has been deemed complete they have 30-45 days to make their onsite inspection. If all goes as expected we should be in a position to occupy the area mid to late April.

• Phase one renovation of the ER renovation is nearing substantial completion. Phase two of this will then occur. There will be no request of occupancy until the phase 2 is complete. Final completion is on schedule for a June date.

### HSB 2 Renovation

• Renovation to finish out the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of HSB 2 is well underway with interior walls being erected and some mechanical electrical work underway. This project is scheduled for completion in July.

### PROS Employee Fitness Area

 Purchase orders have been submitted for the work required to convert former Physical Therapy space in the basement into an employee fitness area. MDH PROS donation will cover the majority of expense related to this project.

### Website and Social Media

Since the launch of the redesigned website on January 12, the Homepage has been viewed 34,369 times with the most viewed pages being; ecards (36,881), the homepage and calendar of events (16,405). The new site offers a virtual tour of the hospital, responsive design for use on any device, modern look, along with all the same great features as before.

The MDH Facebook page is now at over 1,222 likes, gaining 35 likes in February. Twitter has increased to over 255 followers. Information promoted in February on Social Media included; Ameren Illinois donation, Ag Mech show, U.S. Chamber of Commerce visit to MDH, MidAmerica donation, Home Health star rating, MDH Business of the Year award, Marine Bank donation, Apple Award, and Job of the Week. The most viewed, liked and shared item in February was the announcement of Jodi Abernathy, FNP joining MMG with over 8,700 views.

### News media

February news included the following: CPR Classes, Ameren Illinois donating \$10,000 to MDH Foundation, MidAmerica National Bank donating \$10,000 to MDH Foundation, Jodi Abernathy joining MMG, ACO announcement, First Aid Class, Home Health receiving 4.5 Stars and Marine Bank pledging \$10,000 to MDH Foundation.

### Advertising/Marketing

Commercial spots are running for Sports Medicine & Rehabilitation Services, Home Health and general MDH spot. Orthopedics and Sports Medicine radio spots are running during all high school sporting events and WIU sporting events. General radio spots include Dr. Smith and Senior Behavioral Health. Other February advertising included; senior behavioral health, home health & hospice, orthopedics, and Dr. Smith.

### Other

Work began on the spring issue of Vital Signs, the MDH community newsletter, highlighting MDH Services and news. Vital Signs will be in homes the end of March, early April. The spring issue of Health Connection, MMG newsletter, is complete and now available. Progress has started on the initial marketing of the Pain Management Center.

### Foundation Report

### Annual Support

In February \$34,309.76 was received and \$17,000.00 was pledged for a total of \$51,309.76 raised; 165 gifts and 9 memorials were processed. Some of the areas receiving support include: Dolores Kator Switzer Women's Center (DKSWC), PROS, Hospice, Alzheimer's Memory Support, Linda's Fund and Emergency Services.

### DKSWC Capital Campaign

To date, nearly \$3.3 million has been raised for the DKSWC Campaign. A grant for \$10,000 from the Ameren Illinois Foundation was received! Marine Bank pledged \$10,000 toward the project and presented \$2,000 toward their commitment. A \$10,000 check was received from MidAmerica National Bank in support of the DKSWC. Table Grove State Bank pledged \$15,000 toward the project. Presentations to four additional financial institutions were held. Grant applications were submitted to the Gladys Brooks Foundation and the RGK Foundation. Grant writing has begun for Hearst, BNSF, Wal-Mart and Verizon Foundations. The next meeting is scheduled for March 23.

Nearly 60 Society members attended the annual Recognition Reception held on February 4, at the Macomb Country Club. A presentation was held to recognize 17 new members in 2015. New members for the month of February include Pam Kelso and Diane Mayhew. The next meeting is scheduled for April 7.

### Tevar 5K Run/Walk

Plans are underway for the Tevar Run/Walk scheduled for Saturday, April 23, with a race start/finish at The Old Dairy. Committee meetings were held on February 2 and 23 to finalize a new route, choose a t-shirt and design, and to confirm promotional materials.

### PROS

More than 400 meals were served at the Big Game party Friday, February 5. A big thanks to the Morrison food service team for catering the event! Plans are moving forward to renovate the previous therapy gym into an employee Fitness Room. A contract with O'Shea Builders was signed to construct new doorways and install a badge reader for entry. An ecofriendly floor covering was chosen and ordered. The PROS committee voted to increase the project pledge to \$43,000 to cover the additional cost involved with construction, flooring and equipment. Estimated time of completion is early May followed by a grand opening event for all to attend. Sales continue for MDH apparel and promotional items on-line and through the Foundation office.

### Other




