

Colorectal cancer

Colorectal cancer starts as a growth on the inner lining of the colon or rectum. These growths are called polyps.

Not all polyps turn into a cancer, and we can prevent most colon cancer cases with routine screening.

Risk Factors

- Overweight
- Physical inactivity
- Diets high in red and processed meats
- Smoking

- Excessive alcohol use
- Family history of colorectal cancer
- Race and ethnicity
- History of cancer

Should you be concerned?

If you're 45 and older or having symptoms,

YES!

Signs and Symptoms

- A change in your bowel habits, including: diarrhea, constipation, or a change in the consistency of your stool that lasts longer than four weeks
- Rectal bleeding or blood in your stool
- Weakness or fatigue

- Persistent abdominal discomfort, such as cramps, gas, or pain
- A feeling that your bowel doesn't empty completely
- Unexplained weight loss



Employee Assistance Program

When a problem is bothering you or a member of your immediate household, simply contact a counselor at Resource Management Services, our Employee Assistance Program. A simple phone call will get an immediate response, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. An appointment can usually be offered within 48 hours and will be conveniently located in Macomb (or Peoria if you prefer).

Some common topics that are discussed are: family and individual counseling; depression and anxiety; family conflicts; divorce or separation; financial problems; parenting; abuse; sexuality; low self-esteem; eating disorders; stress management and career issues; legal advice; and much more.

Confidentiality is the key, and your privacy is assured. The counselors cannot release information to anyone (including your employer) without your written consent.
