MDH Colorectal Cancer Screening

MDH Outreach Services offered free Colorectal Cancer Screening during the months of March and April. Excluding skin cancer, colorectal cancer is one of the most common cancers diagnosed both in men and women in the United States, it is important for people to get screened. The Hemoccult-ICT test kits were provided free of charge to anyone in the community. This year 182 kits were distributed and 128 kits completed and returned to Lab for a 70% return rate. And 11% of the kits that were processed had positive results - those individuals were encouraged to receive follow-up care from their primary care provider for further testing.

The MDH Lab did an outstanding job of receiving the completed kits and providing results. Public Relations featured Dr. Biagini, Dr. Gonzales, and Stacie Mynatt, RN, on social media to promote the importance of early detection, diagnosis, and treatment for this disease. Thank you to all the staff who helped distribute the kits. This screening would not have been so successful without the amazing team effort!

When Can Hospice Help?

Located on the MDH campus is one of the most highly regarded Hospice teams. Our professional team includes: nurses, social services, certified aides, a physician, a nurse practitioner as well as volunteers. Although palliative care can provide a great benefit, there are still common myths about the service:

MYTH: When I hear the word hospice, I think of an individual who is terminally diagnosed with cancer.

FACT: Many patients and families who benefit from the approach to focus on care, not cure, do not suffer from cancer. Receiving care at home, and stopping repeated hospitalizations, allows hospice care to be very appropriate for those with chronic diseases that cannot be cured, such as: heart failure, emphysema, COPD, Chronic Kidney Disease, Parkinson's Disease, ALS, dementia, liver disease, or other chronic condition that present challenges and uncomfortable symptoms.

MYTH: A patient must live in his/her home in order to receive Hospice services.

FACT: Hospice care is delivered in the nursing home or assisted living facilities as well as private homes.

PATIENT Ice and Water Machine Notice:

Discarding Liquids:

NOT a Sink: All discarded liquids should be poured down an appropriate sink and not the trays on the ice and water machines. They are not meant for disposal purposes.

Rationale: Drainage trays are designed to catch excess ice and water only. Drainage tubes are small, pouring coffee, soda, and other liquids will create sludge and drainage problems. Sugar, coffee grounds, and other debris also clog the drain. Liquid then stands in the tray and can pose health risks.

Filling Drinks:

Keep it CLEAN and EMPTY: Ice should only be dispensed in a clean empty cup.

Rationale: Adding ice to a liquid causes splashing. The splashing contaminates the exterior of the machine and dispensing spout. Clean ice then comes down the spout and picks up the contamination. The outside of the patient cup touches the dispensing lever and then is taken to the room. Prevent transmission by using a clean cup every time.

Please keep our ice and water machines clean, safe, and properly functioning for our patients.






