



West Prairie Volleyball Donates to Linda's Fund





Looking for Advice?

Dear Lucy,

The holidays are here and I'm already dreading upcoming events. Specifically, I'm not looking forward to time with family. I have one in-law in particular who has a need to question everything I do. She wants to know why I set the rules I do with my children, why I don't make an effort to get a better job, why I don't eat more and even why I put mustard in my Waldorf salad. I told my husband I've had enough of her criticism and would rather not attend family gatherings where she is present. He has said I may do whatever I want, but he and the children will still be going. Should I ignore the situation or stand my ground?

Don't Want to be a Scrooge

Dear Don't Want to be a Scrooge,

Remember we can't choose our relatives, but we can pick our battles. You will need to seriously consider if this one is worth picking. Is everyone in your family insensitive or is it just her? Are you willing to alienate other family members because this person is rude? There may be other approaches to take.

I would encourage you to consider your own level of sensitivity. People who are more sensitive tend to see things at a more intense level. Sensitive people are more in tune with feelings and when there's something good going on, they enjoy it thoroughly. Conversely when they are faced with something uncomfortable they become enveloped in negativity. When we feel slighted or hurt, there's a tendency to blame the person who has hurt us. Ask yourself do you believe the person is trying to make you feel incompetent, embarrassed or worthless? Naming the perceived accusation may allow you to explore if there's something else going on within yourself. Are you more sensitive because you sometimes worry about these very things?

You may determine your in-law is oblivious to the fact that her words are annoying you. If your feelings are seriously hurt not addressing the situation may lead to anger and resentment. In that case, you may need to talk with the person in a calm, diplomatic manner to clear the air. If you decide to do so, say what you need to say as briefly as you can. Sometimes when we talk too much, people tune us out and dismiss what we have to say. State what it is that bothers you, how you feel about her comments, what you want her to do differently and thank her for understanding.

If you decide to attend family get-togethers and you choose not to address the issue, and your in-law makes an insensitive comment you may want to excuse yourself, or simply walk away from the person and find a quiet place to calm and regroup. Take a moment to focus your thoughts on a more pleasant experience or remind yourself of what is important to you during this special time of year. Remember, sometimes saying nothing sends the strongest message.

2017 Flexible Benefit Spending Accounts



The Flexible Benefit Accounts are used to pay healthcare and day care expenses with pretax earnings. If elected, a portion of your salary is set aside for these accounts and then deducted from your paycheck. After you have paid for the services and submitted the appropriate paperwork to Human Resources by the last Friday of the pay period, you are reimbursed for a tax-deductible medical expense not covered by your insurance or for daycare expenses for your children or dependent parents on your next paycheck.

The main benefit of this program is the tax advantage – you save approximately \$25 on every \$100 spent. Based on your need and the need of your family, you allocate a certain portion of your salary to be used for these accounts. This amount is then divided by 26 pay periods and deducted from your paycheck on a pretax basis. Please estimate conservatively since unused money is lost.

As a Status 1 or Status 7 employee, you are eligible to participate in the program and will need to sign an enrollment form if decide to participate. The annual enrollment period is now through December 30. Forms need returned to Human Resources by 12/31/16. More detailed information will come in the near future and will be available in Human Resources or on the Human Resources page of the intranet.

Garden Veggie and Herb Meatballs

Ingredients

- 1 pound ground beef, preferably grass fed and pastured
- 1 and ½ cups packed shredded vegetables (zucchini, yellow summer squash, and carrot)
- 2 TBS fresh herbs, finely chopped (basil, cilantro, or parsley)
- ¼ small onion, finely chopped
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 tsp HERBAMARE seasoning OR 1 and ¼ tsp celtic sea salt
- 1 egg, whipped
- 2 pinches of celtic sea salt

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400'F and line a baking sheet with parchment paper
- 2. Place shredded vegetables into a colander in the sink. Sprinkle with 2 pinches of sea salt and mix well. Allow to sit for 10 minutes. Then place veggies into a clean hand towel and SQUEEZE out all of the moisture in them. Set aside.
- 3. Meanwhile, puree onion and garlic together in a small food processor.
- 4. Combine ground beef, squeezed out veggies, onion/garlic mixture, chopped herbs, herbamare (or plain sea salt), and egg in a large bowl. Mix with your hands until well combined
- 5. Roll into desired sized meatballs and place onto baking sheet
- 6. Bake for 25-30 minutes until brown and cooked all the way through
- 7. Serve immediately OR allow to cool and freeze for later
- 8. ENJOY!!!



President's Report

The MDH Board of Directors met November 21. Here is Mr. Boyd's report to the Board for the accounting period of October 18 through November 21, 2016.



Quality and Innovation

Service Excellence

Feedback sessions have been completed to report results of the 2016 AHRQ Hospital Survey on Patient Safety Culture. Invited participants included hospital staff who have direct contact or interaction with patients and hospital staff whose work directly affects patient care.

Survey questions are categorized by unit/department level, hospital level, and outcome variables. Questions focus on different aspects that may impact patient safety including but not limited to teamwork, handoffs and transition of care, communication and staffing. Service Excellence entered survey responses into the AHRQ database, which allows for trending and comparative data.

Following is a summary of results:

- The 2016 response rate is 48% compared to 52% in 2014.
- Overall, the percent of favorable responses decreased in 2016 from 2014.
- The top four concerns identified during the feedback sessions include:
 - o Staffing
 - o Cerner
 - o Handoffs
 - o Falls

- Senior team leaders have been assigned to the top four concerns for further evaluation of improvement opportunities.
- Staff recommendations were also included in the report.

Infection Control

Patients undergoing total joint procedures can now receive nasal antiseptic prior to their surgery. Applying this antiseptic one hour before surgery can reduce the amount of bacteria in the nose and may reduce the risk of infection after surgery. Reduction of nasal bacteria is a recommendation by the Institute for Healthcare Improvement Guide to Prevent Surgical Site Infection for Hip and Knee Arthroplasty.

For the first time in our employee influenza vaccination program, we have achieved 94.7%. We have met our goal and exceeded it by a substantial amount. This enabled us to award 20 employees with a twenty-five dollar Chamber Gift Certificate.

Outpatient Phlebotomy Throughput

Two changes started in the beginning on November. The first change established appointments for outpatient phlebotomy. This change should reduce the wait time for those phlebotomy patients. The second change was to register a patient for future, multiple phlebotomy sessions. This change should significantly reduce or eliminate the wait time for registration.

Physician Recruitment/ Retention

Physician, Advance Practice Provider Recruitment & Outreach Services – Update:

OB/GYN: We are finalizing our contract discussions with our practicing, OB/GYN candidate at this time and all indications are favorable. Dr. Smith and Adrian MacGregor have conducted an initial phone interview with a practicing OB/GYN currently in Kansas. We are evaluating schedules for a possible site visit, the first of the new year.

Pediatrics: At this point in time, we have received two expressions of interest resulting from our marketing activities. We've ruled out one candidate based upon an initial phone interview and currently evaluating the second candidate further. We will be conducting targeted, direct-mail campaign throughout the Midwest region in an effort to generate additional exposure to the practice opportunity. This will be completed by the end of November 2016. Adrian MacGregor is also working with two contingency recruitment firms at this time.

Outreach Services

Community Outreach

Caring for You Cancer Series – This is a new program for cancer survivors and caregivers. It is focused on creating a dedicated space and time for relaxation and healing. On October 25, the West Central Illinois Arts Center hosted this event and Natalie Shelly from the Macomb Park District assisted the participants in creating ceramic

items. On November 16th, Western Illinois University hosted a free Cooking Class with the dietetic students preparing several holiday dishes for those who are dealing with cancer. Another Caring for You class will take place on December 14 at Macomb City Hall with Bill Maakestad leading a Tai Chi Class.

Provider Outreach

On November 4th, MDH participated in the Retirees Learning Institute at Spoon River College. MDH Outreach Services and Home Health/Hospice provided a booth to perform blood pressure screenings and had activities/materials relating to sodium intake. Jen Balka from the Pain Management Clinic, along with Drs. Minter and Wehner provided educational sessions regarding "The Medicare Wellness Visit" and "What is Osteopathic Medicine", respectively.

Employer Outreach

Our "Snacking with the Docs" Series as part of the employee wellness partnership with Macomb Schools included the following programs for District faculty, staff, and employees (held after school at the different school buildings):

- October 18 Dr. Wehner on "Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment or Medicine"
- 2. November 2 WIU Dietary students presenting a program on "Healthy Holiday Eating"
- 3. November 9 Dr. Ali on "The Importance of Cancer Screenings"

Additionally, on October 25th, Dr. Haseena Ali presented on

"The Importance of Cancer Screenings" for the employees at Pella Corporation.

MDH Outreach Staff (Health Educators Stephanie Crockett and Diane Tate), along with Janene Shockency, RN, from the Diabetes Education Center, traveled to the Training and Detention Facility in Rushville, IL, to participate in a Health Fair for their employees. Participants received blood glucose screenings and had their blood pressures checked.

Information Systems

Cerner Update

We are working with departments to identify their top 10 Cerner list to insure that we are keeping focus on those items for resolution. We have discovered some training/workflow issues and setup issues that could be easily worked out, but not reported. There are some areas that we need to reinforce a movement to the Cerner applications in place of manual processes and we still have some configuration items to be resolved. According to Cerner, roughly 26% of our open issues are left over from our implementation build and processes. The remaining 70+% are issues encountered after implementation that require assistance or change requests.

The on-site assistance for Pharmacy Supply Chain in mid-October has helped to correct some inventory issues with decrementing medications when it is dispensed from the system. The Cerner physician resource that worked with our medical staff in early November was successful in the review of their utilization of the system and to

answer their questions to improve their experience.

Financial Performance

October 2016

Total Operating Revenue was down 16.8% from budget. While negative to budget, is an improvement from last month. This again is mostly resulting from lower volumes than budgeted. Inpatient Revenue including Senior Behavioral Health was down 16.3% and 36.1% respectively. ER revenue was down 11.8% mostly due to volumes though there is some lag in capture of ER physician revenue due to the transition to Cerner. OR procedures were down 30.5% which also impacts Outpatient ancillary revenue as OR procedures affect activity in most all areas. Radiology volumes were down in all areas and the Department Leader is working with Cerner to determine if there is a system issue that is causing the problem. On a positive note, Swing Bed revenue is doing very well as we had a 100% increase in volume over budget. MMG revenue was also positive to budget though visits were down slightly (about 2.3%).

Total Deductions from Revenue were below budget by 12.5% impacted this month by the reduction in Charity Care as well as the reduction in volumes. Total Operating Expenses were 13.9% below budget or a little over \$1M. We ended the month with a loss of \$3,691 – not at our budget target of \$286,784, but an improvement from the prior two months.

Facility Planning

MDH Project

CoHarold O'Shea Builders issued the certificate of substantial completion for the project on November 2nd. IDPH has scheduled their inspection for Tuesday November 15th for what we hope will be their certification for final occupancy which would officially end the project.

Dolores Kator Switzer Women's Center

There have been several meetings with the design team and MDH staff aimed at finalizing the schematic design of the project. There is another meeting scheduled for November 21st.

Public Relations Report

Website and Social Media

During October there were 20,907 home page visits (+373 from September), 4,376 career views and 12,611 calendar views.

The MDH Facebook page is now at over 1,475 likes, gaining 20 likes in October. Twitter has increased to over 300 followers. Information promoted on Social Media included: donations to the Women's Center campaign, Breast Cancer Awareness month and MDH programs, Dessert with a Doc, Rocky Quest, Flu Clinic, Dr. Ali accepting patients, Senator Dick Durbin visit, Apple Award, Job of the week and more.

News media

October news included the following: donations to the Dolores Kator Switzer Women's Center campaign, Breast Cancer "Power of Believing" program, Dessert with a Doc, Mammography Assistance Program, West Prairie donating to Linda's Fund, MDH Flu Shot Policy, CPR & First Aid classes and childbirth classes.

Advertising/Marketing

Commercial spots are running for Sports Medicine & Rehabilitation Services, Home Health and general MDH spot. A MMG Family Clinic commercial began running during the World Series and election night, along with regular scheduling. General radio spots include; Obstetrics & Gynecology Clinic, Pain Management Center, Senior Behavioral Health, Orthopedics & Sports Medicine, Home Health and Family Clinic. Other October advertising included; Senior Behavioral Health, Home Health & Hospice, Orthopedics, Obstetrics & Gynecology Clinic, Pain Management Center, Family Clinic and Dr. Ali.

Other

The KHQA morning team visited MDH on October 19 and did a feature story on mammograms and MDH Radiology. Lynn Durso showed the process of getting a mammogram and answered questions. The special aired on October 27.

Foundation Report

This report reflects activity held within the month of October 2016.

Annual Support

In October \$27,930.91 was received in cash and \$18,846.00 was pledged for a total of \$46,776.91 raised; 180 gifts and 11 memorials were processed. Some of the areas receiving support included: Dolores Kator Switzer Women's Center (DKSWC), Emergency Services, Festival of Trees, Hospice, Linda's Fund, and PROS.

DKSWC Capital Campaign

To date, \$4,188,676.84 has been raised toward the DKSWC Campaign goal of \$5.5M. Grant applications have been submitted to Walgreens, Gladys Brooks, Verizon, BNSF, Ameren, Fellheimer, Cook Medical, Niemann Foods and Springfield Clinic. Letters of Intent were mailed to seven Foundations for permission to apply for grants and nine other grants have been identified. A total of \$3,475 was raised through "Believe" breast cancer awareness shirts in support of DKSWC. The next meeting is scheduled on November 4.

Golden Apple Society

New Diamond level (\$30,000) member is Gil Belles. New Golden level (\$10,000) members are Harlan & Elizabeth Baker and Kent Slater & Penny Lawyer. The committee met on October 13, where the 2017 Recognition Reception date was set for February 2, at the Macomb Country Club. To date, there are 20 new members to recognize at the event. The committee continues to identify and recruit new members.

The annual appreciation meeting is scheduled for December 8. The committee voted to purchase Christmas lights for the hospital entrances and will decorate trees for the main and emergency doorways. PROS is providing airtight, clear containers for storing teddy bears in clinical areas. A procedure of when and how to order the bears from Storeroom is attached to the container for reference.

Golf Tournament

A wrap up meeting was held on October 3, to celebrate a record high profit of \$40,308.00 in support of the Women's Center. Surveys were sent to past participants to ask if they prefer the Outing to be held on Friday or Saturday and times. The majority voted for Saturday, the 2017 date has been set for September 9.

Festival of Trees

The Festival events are in full swing and more than \$25,000 has been raised through sponsorships. MDH Festival events include Teddy Bear T (Ladies Night Out) November 28; Jingle 'n Mingle (Gala) December 1; and Festival of Trees December 2-5. To date, there are 36 tree decorators and 19 themed baskets for the silent auction at Jingle 'n Mingle. Visit mdh.org to get a sneak preview of auction items.
