A+ Achievement

Jen Wagoner, Physical Therapist, from MDH Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation Services attended the Vestibular Rehabilitation: A Competency Based Course in Los Angeles, June 23-28. The six day, evidence-based course taught through Duke University consisted of lecture, laboratory sessions and additional self-study sessions. Participants were required to demonstrate assessment skills to faculty including: oculomotor examination with emphasis on the identification of nystagmus and canal involvement; differentiation between central and peripheral system disorders; balance, gait and fall risks assessments and functional assessments. Participants were tested on the appropriate treatment procedures for BPPV affecting posterior, anterior and horizontal canals for both cupulolithiasis and canalithiasis; for unilateral and bilateral peripheral vestibular disorders and for central vestibular disorders including concussion, traumatic brain injury and stroke. Emphasis was given on the utilization of assessment results to develop an individualized, effective treatment plan for patients with vestibular disorders. The course concluded with both a written and video examination. Upon passing, Jen received a Certificate of Completion from the American Physical Therapy Association. There are currently less than 5,000 PT's across America with this certificate.



President's Report

The MDH Board of Directors met September 18. Here is Mr. Boyd's report to the Board for the accounting period of August 22 -September 18, 2017.



Quality

Service Excellence

In partnership with Press Ganey, MDH began participating in the voluntary data collection for Outpatient and Ambulatory Surgery Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (OAS CAHPS). In the near future, CMS (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services) will require a mandatory implementation for Medicare-certified hospital outpatient departments and ambulatory surgery centers.

Much like the other government mandated surveys, the OAS CAHPS survey is designed to measure the patient's perception of care.

The survey has 5 Domains:

- Before Your Procedure
 - Information and instructions the patient recent prior to their procedure
- About the Facility and Staff
 - Check-In, Cleanliness of facility, Helpfulness, courtesy and respect from the doctors, nurses, and clerks/ receptionists
- Communication About Your Procedure
 - Level of explanation related to the procedure by the doctors and nurses, anesthesia use, side effects, and discharge

instructions (verbal and written)

- Your Recovery
 - What to expect during recovery, pain management, other medication use, signs and symptoms to watch for during recovery phase
- Your Overall Experience
 - Overall Rating of Care and Likelihood to Recommend
- Questions about the Patient Demographics

In early 2018, CMS will publicly report the data collected during the voluntary implementation.

Patient Safety

- MDH will be participating in CAUTI and C diff simulation training events through the HIIN. Training events are highly engaging and emphasize the use of simulation-based strategies to facilitate change. The focus of these events will be to provide attendees with simulation-based tools and techniques to augment the pursuit of higher quality care, patient safety and healthcare resiliency at the unit level. The four breakout sessions will be focused on Patient & Family Engagement, Technical Skills, Sociotechnical Risk Assessment and Attitude and Safety Culture.
- MDH is participating in the clostridium difficile (C diff) infection Improvement Action Network in 3rd Quarter which is July through September 2017. The MDH goal for this project is to maintain zero hospital acquired C diff infections for inpatients on acute care and ICU through FY2017. The first tests of change include evaluating lab capabilities

related to testing, evaluating timeliness of orders, improving education and incorporation of personal protective equipment competencies.

Projects

- Phlebotomy Wait Times: The project is documenting the process changes into the standard procedures for the lab and registration.
- Report Processes: Standard procedures for report writing, charge maintenance and order maintenance have been identified for completion to close the project.

Infection Control

- Infection Control attended the annual Illinois Council on Tuberculosis (ICOT) conference on August 31st in Springfield, IL. The purpose of the conference is to enhance the knowledge of Tuberculosis (TB) care and management as well as to identify new and upcoming advances in Tuberculosis. The conference featured expert speakers from the state level as well as the Mayo Clinic and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention(CDC).
- The Infection Control Team has been working to increase monitoring of hand hygiene in their continued efforts to evaluate compliance with this important patient safety initiative. We are happy to announce the addition of the Senior Behavioral Health unit to the hand hygiene surveillance program. One individual has completed the Joint Commission Targeted Solutions Tool for hand hygiene observations and the

other one will complete training soon.

Physician Recruitment/Retention

Physician Recruitment and Outreach Services - Update:

Hospitalist Medicine: We are moving forward with coordinating appropriate steps for one of our own, Family Practitioners to assist with the Hospitalist service. Additionally, we've received an expression of interest from a practicing hospitalist that would have interest in working part-time for MDH. At this time we are evaluating both options.

OB/GYN: On-going discussions are taking place with two practicing Obstetricians/Gynecologists regarding our practice opportunity. Our desire is to secure a site visit with one of the candidates this month.

Pediatrics: At this time we are continuing to search for a Pediatrician. We are following up with one lead from OSF – Peoria recruitment fair this month.

Emergency Medicine: We are evaluating an ER physician candidate that was recently forwarded to us by one of our contingency recruitment partners.

Outreach Services

Community Outreach

Outreach Services provided First Aid and CPR training to several area employers and groups including: West Prairie Schools staff and bus drivers, WIU Communication and Speech Disorders department, as well as WIU nursing students. A total of 65 participants were served within these groups.

Employer Outreach

MDH Outreach Services rolled out the goals for the employee wellness program for Macomb Schools as part of the "Opening Day" along with Dr. Mark Twomey. Faculty, Staff, and employees attended this event. MDH and Macomb Schools are entering their fourth year in this employee wellness partnership.

Adrian MacGregor has finalized the MDH Wellness Solutions product offering and will begin introducing this to employers through Q1 and Q2 of FY '18. To date we have 5 employers utilizing MMG Family Clinic and MDH Laboratory services for a variety of work place health needs. Stephanie Crockett in assistance with MMG administration, is coordinating and enhancing the current service offerings within our existing employer relationships. Currently, our largest referral sources for preemployment physicals are NTN Bower Corporation and Durham **Bus Services**.

Information Systems

Cerner Update

Implementation for the OB department transition to Cerner Power Chart Maternity has started. We are working through the training of the applications and preparing for the installation of the Fetal Link monitoring functionality that will be used with the Cerner application. We are working toward go live the first week of January 2018.

Dictation Speech Recognition Update Additional licensing has been purchased and installed. We will be working with additional clinic and ER physicians for implementation in their areas as needed.

Telemedicine Update

We are working with SIU Telehealth Clinical Services to prepare our ICU rooms, and two patient rooms on the Acute Care 3rd floor for access. This will allow for direct access with the telemedicine equipment for consultations with SIU physicians. One of the first subspecialties that are being considered will be pulmonology. We are installing the cabling in September with training to begin later in the month and a first possible use in October.

Financial

August 2017

We ended the month with a positive bottom line of \$14,943. For the second month in a row, Inpatient Services were positive to budget. Acute Inpatient revenue was up 11.5% compared to budget due to an increase in volumes though Swing Bed admissions were 75% below budget causing revenue in that area to be negative to budget. Volumes in Emergency Services are still soft through this summer month which is reflected in the revenues. Outpatient and MMG exceeded their revenue targets as we saw an increase in surgical procedures as well as several other ancillary areas.

Overall, Total Patient Revenue was up by \$455,195. However, deductions from revenue were above budget by \$690,860 due to an increase in Charity Care and Bad Debt. Overall, expenses were slightly below budget by 1.2% or \$81,329.

Public Relations

General radio spots include; Obstetrics & Gynecology Clinic, Orthopedics & Sports Medicine, Home Health and Family Clinic. Other advertising included, Senior Behavioral Health, Home Health & Hospice, Orthopedics, Obstetrics & Gynecology Clinic, Pediatric Clinic and Family Clinic.

Other

Summer issue of Vital Signs was distributed to homes in August, highlighting MDH Care Coordination. The fall 2017 Health Connections issue has been published and distributed.

Foundation

This report reflects activity held within the month of August 2017.

Annual Support

In August, \$31,001.91 was received and \$18,961.53 pledged for a total of \$49,963.44 raised; 244 gifts and 13 honor/memorials were processed. Some of the areas receiving support included: Hospice, PROS, Golf Tournament and Switzer Women's Center.

Golden Apple Society

New Gold members are Adrian & Kathleen MacGregor and Max & Diane Pierson. A meeting was held on August 1 to finalize plans for the Social and update prospect list. The August 23rd Summer Social at Dave and Jackie Thompson's home entertained 110 member/guests! The next meeting is scheduled for October 5.

Golf Tournament

To date, nearly \$45,000 has been raised with 142 golfers registered. The food is set and signs/flags ordered. Wind shirts, golf balls and mini golf bags for each participant were ordered and received. The committee is busy collecting raffle prizes for the September 9 event.

Fly Vaccination Time is Coming Soon!

Be on the lookout for dates, times and locations for our healthcare worker flu vaccination program! Flu vaccine is scheduled to be delivered soon and we anticipate starting our program in early October.

2017-2018 Flu Season:

- 1. Healthcare workers choosing to be vaccinated will be provided a badge sticker.
- 2. If receiving flu vaccine from somewhere other than MDH Infection Control, a copy of the flu vaccine administration documentation *must* be provided to Infection Control in order to receive a badge sticker.
- 3. All healthcare workers choosing to receive vaccination must be vaccinated or provide documentation of vaccination by October 16. After October 16 all healthcare workers not vaccinated or who have not provided documentation of vaccination will be required to wear a surgical mask until vaccinated or proof of vaccination is provided to Infection Control.
- 4. If waiving flu vaccination due to medical or personal reasons, the healthcare worker is choosing to wear a surgical mask through the influenza season. A new form is available on the Intranet to print and document waiver. This form can be placed in the in-house mail to Infection Control.

Looking for Advice?

Dear Lucy,

My wife, who is G1, has degenerative disc disorder and is treated with hydrocodone to help relieve her pain. She's been taking it for several years. My opinion is her doctor provides these drugs far too liberally, although I know she is in a great deal of pain especially after working a 12-hour shift on her feet. My concern is i'm aware she also occasionally takes additional pain medication I am prescribed for arthritis and she has prescriptions from two different doctors. When I confronted her about this she let me know she has days when her medicine alone doesn't curb her discomfort. When I express my concern, she gets quite angry and won't discuss it further. I've read about the increasing problem of opioid addiction and am wondering if my wife could be in danger of falling into this category.

Dear Husband,

Prescription drug abuse is reported to be second, only to marijuana, as the most commonly misused substance in our country. Misuse of a prescription drug is defined as taking a drug in any way that a doctor did not prescribe the patient to use it. Therefore, your wife certainly is misusing opioid medication. According to a recent article in the AARP Bulletin, studies show in 2015, 2.7 million Americans over age 50 abused painkillers, meaning they took them for reasons or amounts beyond what their doctor prescribed.

The aches and pains associated with aging makes it more likely that older Americans are using prescription drugs to manage their discomfort. Opioids are strong painkillers, but they are also highly addictive if they are taken for too long or in too large a dose. Examples of these medicines include Oxycodone, Percocet and Vicodin. The medical community is now taking the stance that typically these drugs should be used for shorter periods of time to help relieve acute pain and only as a last resort for chronic pain.

Signs that a person's medication use may have developed into abuse or dependency may include situations when the person cannot stop him/herself from taking the drug or when there is an increase in tolerance, meaning the person needs to take more than the prescribed dosage to achieve the same effect. Also of concern would be if the person is consulting with more than one doctor to get the same prescribed medication, taking more medicine than the label suggests, avoiding conversations about the medication, hiding the bottle of pills, or demonstrating behavior changes such as becoming more withdrawn or suddenly getting angry.

Please encourage your wife to have a frank conversation with her physician about her use of painkillers.
Feelings of shame or of being a failure at managing their lives are some common reasons why seniors don't seek help. It might also be helpful for your wife to join the pain management group through Behavioral Health Services to learn alternative ways to cope.

This year's vaccine is quadrivalent, covering four strains of the flu virus, including H1N1.

Flu shots are available for the general public to anyone <u>**18 years of age or older**</u>. Participants are asked to wear a short sleeve shirt as all shots are given in the upper arm.

There is no out-of-pocket charge to the Medicare Part B recipient. Persons with Medicare Part B must present their Medicare card, and MDH will bill for this service. The flu shot is \$30 for all other persons. Participants may pay with cash, check, or credit card, including Mastercard, Visa, and Discover.
