From the President/CEO: *Kenny Boyd*



Greetings from MDH,

There has been a lot going on at MDH and in Healthcare over the last year each presenting its own unique challenges and opportunities for our organization and community. Some come with exciting results while others require difficult and sometimes unpopular decisions. We continue to work to ensure the long term viability of MDH while continuing to provide quality patient care in a safe environment.

Some of the things we have seen in the past year include:

- Obstetrics & Gynecology Clinic: The addition of two nurse midwives, a Women's Health Nurse
 Practitioner and an OB/GYN (Dr. Amerson) in addition to Dr. Smith. This talented group of
 providers will ensure the continued availability of women's health services to our communities.
- Primary Care: We added a great deal of depth to the primary care base with the additions of Drs. Patel, Wehner and Ali as well as three Nurse Practitioners. These providers will increase access to and provide stability for our communities primary care needs.
- Last fall we finalized the work on our expansion/renovation project which began in 2014. This project improved our facilities to better meet the needs of both our patients and caregivers.

With the changes in healthcare and the impact of the states multi-year budget impasse our community and organization have seen a decline in enrollment and employment at Western Illinois University which has impacted the demand on our services. To ensure our future viability we made some difficult budget decision beginning with our 2018 fiscal year. These include, but are not limited to:

- Working with our vendors, physicians and employees to reduce our non-labor spend by approximately \$1.8 million dollars for next year and beyond.
- Working with our leaders and staff to reduce labor hours, to match patient demand, by approximately 65,000 hours or \$1.6 million dollars for next year and beyond.
- We are currently working with a private entity and the city of Macomb to move the EMS
 Ambulance service to a private operation with the opportunity to include a private/public
 partnership. This will allow us to operate the service more efficiently, improve training and education
 for the EMS staff, potentially reduce overhead for the City and retain, if not increase, the level of
 services provided for our community.

We continue to work towards the future and invest in our people, plant and equipment to remain competitive in our environment and attract and retain quality healthcare providers. A few of the items we are/will be working on to achieve this are:

- Participation in an Accountable Care Organization (ACO), which will allow us to better understand
 how to provide the right services in the right environment with the intent to improve outcomes and
 decrease costs.
- We are in the early processes of working with SIU School of Medicine, Springfield to bring telehealth to our communities. We anticipate utilizing these services through this partnership to increase access to specialty consults/visits for our patients and providers.
- We are continuing our capital campaign for the Dolores Kator Switzer Women's Center at MDH. We currently have raised \$4.5 million of the \$5.5 million goal. We are excited to see this project come to fruition in order to meet the existing and future health needs of the women in our communities.

There are many improvements happening at MDH and all of it is for one purpose, YOU. We strive to provide the services you need with the quality and safety you expect in a healthcare provider. We do this while always being grateful and humbled that you entrust the care of yourself and your family to our team of quality, dedicated health care professionals.

Care Coordination Services

Do you feel overwhelmed by your medications? Is the healthcare system confusing? Having a hard time making the health changes recommended by your doctor?

If any of this sounds familiar, MDH Care Coordination Services may be able to help!

MDH Care Coordination Services is a new service added in 2016 to assist McDonough Medical Group (MMG) patients with overcoming barriers to improving their health while navigating the confusing healthcare system. Our Nurse Care Coordinators work hand-in-hand with patients, their MMG providers, and staff to plan, coordinate and manage services based on the individual needs and goals of the patient. They also assist patients transitioning from the hospital or nursing home back to their home by coordinating services and ensuring they have all the necessary follow-up care.

Our Care Coordinators work with you and your health care team to:

- Identify health care needs and goals important to YOU and communicate them to your health care team
- Advocate for you and make sure your health care team is meeting your needs
- Explain your health problems, treatments, options and how to improve your health
- Coordinate your health care between primary and specialty care providers, as well as your care within the hospital, clinic and community
- Facilitate access to services at MDH and in the community
- Visit with you in your home as needed

What are the benefits of enrolling in Care Coordination services?

You will have a go-to person to help you navigate the healthcare system and improve your health and well-being. Your Care Coordinator will be your advocate and make sure you are getting well-coordinated, quality care when and where you need it. They will also help find you resources at MDH or in the community to meet your needs.

Who is eligible for Care Coordination?

Patients under the care of a MMG Provider may qualify if they meet certain criteria such as having:

- 2 or more qualifying chronic illnesses
- Multiple visits to the Emergency Department
- Multiple visits to the hospital
- A qualifying health plan



Call 309-837-6937 and ask to speak to a Care Coordinator or talk to your MMG primary care provider at your next appointment. Your provider will refer you into the program.

Happy 1 Year Anniversary to the MDH Pain Management Center

Dr. Grochowski offers balanced acute and chronic pain management services including the diagnosis and treatment of the following pain conditions:

- Neck pain, including work-related injuries
- Back pain, including work-related injuries and sciatica
- Persistent pain after back or neck surgery
- Arthritis pain in neck or lower back
- Complex Regional Pain Syndrome (CRPS)
- Nerve damage or muscle spasm pain
- Shingles pain
- Headaches

Common medical treatments include the use of physical therapy and medication, while common interventional procedures will include epidural steroid injections, facet joint injections, selective nerve root blocks and radiofrequency ablations.

We look forward to continuing to provide quality care to our patients.





Do you or someone you know have more than 15 headache days per month?

If so Botox may be an option for you.

MMG Family Clinic providers Brianne Wehner, DO and Prayag Patel, MD are now offering Botox treatments for patients with chronic headaches.

Botox is not just used for cosmetic reason, it is FDA approved for chronic neck pain, eye twitching, excessive sweating and chronic muscle spasms. Botox is used as a preventative medication to help decrease the number of headache days per month that a person may suffer from.

How many people have tried BOTOX for Chronic Migraines?

BOTOX was approved by the FDA in 2010 after being studied in large clinical trials. Since then, 100,000 people with Chronic Migraines have received BOTOX treatment.

What will the injections feel like?

The needles used in a BOTOX treatment for Chronic Migraines are very small, but you may feel mild discomfort. Many patients say the injections feel like tiny pinches or pinpricks. Typically, the injections should take about 15 minutes.

Where is BOTOX injected?

BOTOX is injected into shallow muscles of the head and neck, not too deeply beneath the skin. Depending on the symptoms, Botox may be injected into 7 major muscle groups around the head and neck every 3 months.

How long does it take?

The procedure takes about 15 minutes and is done in the office.

Is it covered by insurance?

98% of all insurances cover Botox.
